- The first day of school for **Reception** is **Monday, 8th September 2025**.

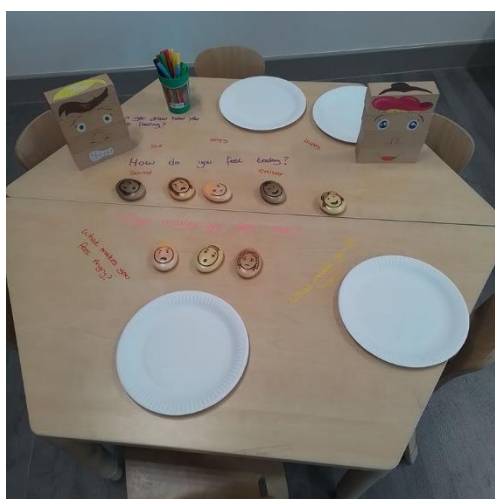

The Robin and Wren Room Children @ Chestnut Nursery School Greatfields have recently started a new book of the moment 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt!' The story has been brought to life through a variety of activities, such as a messy tuff tray where the children have been able to explore different textures - thick oozy mud! The children have also been learning about seasons through the story and what comes first, before, next etc.



Another area of recent focus for The Robin and Wren Room children has been to express our emotions. Children have been able to identify emotions and explain what makes them feel this way. We have been focusing on this using the children's interests, for example using our emotion pebbles in the sand. Through the use of a treasure hunt when the children find the pebble they are encouraged to identify the emotion and what makes them feel this way.



The Jay Room (3 Months - 2 years) Children @ Chestnut Nursery School Greatfields current book of the moment is 'Paddington's Colours'. We have been supporting the children to use single words and make connections of colours - e.g. red bus.

The story has been brought to life through activities such as painting and coloured playdough. These activities have supported the childrens' physical, personal, social and emotional development as they settle into nursery.
